Fireplace in main lodge built in 1911.

The fireplace in the Main Lodge was completed by the members this year.

A steel power boat was purchased for \$63.00 by the members for transportation ease as they had in the past only used canoes and a dingy. The dingy was from a sailboat, The Fusilier, which was owned by some of the members who were in the 21st Regiment of the Essex Fusiliers. This sailboat had been scrapped, due to age, and many parts of the ship had been used in Camp such as the canvas and gadgets which have been noted to have been in use in Camp in the 1939 History notes. A steel motor boat purchased in late 1910 for \$63.00 was not put in use until the 1911 season. It served the Camp until 1916.

Construction began on a lean to type sleeping area on the south side of the lodge using the sails from the Fusilier as the sides like a tent. This was completed in 1912 and enlarged to 15' x 22' in 1915.
