Gordon M. McGregor, an early shareholder (1910) who went to Camp as a guest until he became a member in 1915 passed away March 12, 1922.

In the spring of 1922, the water level rose to the point where the main lodge was three feet under water. When the water receded, the covering over the hidden stash of booze under the cabin was removed exposing the supply and it was reported that the loggers, under the control of Mr. Guy Smith the foreman for the Holt Lumber Company, had quite a party at the expense of Morton's Point Camp ! Guy Smith said his men could smell a cork like a bear smells honey ! The two 10 gallon kegs of whiskey buried on Sandy's Island (Sandy Hook) had not been discovered by the lumberjacks even though they had placed a boom chain directly over them.

A new dam had been constructed on the Mag at a cost of \$45,000.00 and by accident was dynamited. When the temporary dam was being blown up, the first charge opened a large gap which floated the other two charges down to the new dam and when they detonated, the new dam was blown up. The old wooden dam was then repaired instead of rebuilding the new dam again.

The cook for the year was Albert Axford.
