## 1937

The 5 acre portion of land on the north shore just below Lovesick, that Robert Morton had received Patent for in 1910, which had since 1910 been registered to "Morton's Point Camp Ltd., was sold to Mr. W. E. Lee for \$50.00 and later became "The Garden City Hunt Club".

After 25 years, the kitchen was in need of repair. The group re-built the kitchen at a cost of \$375.29 and made it presentable once again. A propane hot water tank was donated to the Camp by Mr. Ladore for the new kitchen. What a treat, hot water ! A wood porch was added to the south side of the kitchen at a cost of \$239.90 and some of the windows in the main lodge were enlarged.

A new 2 man cabin, 12' x 16', was built south of the Kenogan Cabin, near swimming rock, by Bill Pulling who paid for the building himself (\$200.00) but donated it to the Camp for anyone to use when he was not in Camp. Bill Pulling was a large man and had to have a bed specially built to accommodate his size

The dormer window was installed on the second floor of the Main Lodge in order to allow 4 men to sleep upstairs and also to have a better view of the lake from upstairs. It added additional light to the inside 2<sup>nd</sup> floor area and improved the appearance of the building from the lake. The screened in front porch seen in the picture (left) was to be added to the Main Lodge in 1946 - 1947.

A Johnson outboard motor was purchased in Peterborough

for \$120.00.

The Camp had a loss in 1937 of \$200.31. This was due to the amount of repairs and purchases made that would not have to be done again for many years to come.
