William J. Pulling passed away January 18, 1938 . He had been a guest in Camp for a great many years and was loved by all. He had become a member in 1936. His many donations to the camp over the years included the Pulling Cabin, motors and his time.

A water holding tank was installed in the rafters on the second floor of the main lodge this year to provide gravity fed water pressure to the kitchen sink. A sink was installed on the second floor of the lodge at the same time. The holding tank was supplied by an electric water pump in the boathouse. Yet another modern day luxury. What we consider a necessity now was quite an improvement back then. The holding tank was in later years removed and replaced by a larger steel tank placed up the hill to the rear of the main lodge, as more buildings were set up with water supplies and greater pressure was required.

Guy Hayward was instructed to inspect the main lodge roof to see if replacement was required and to supply a price of repairs or replacement to the Board.

Cooks were hired for the year. They were Mr. & Mrs. Thomas Griffith at the same rate of pay as was given to Mr. & Mrs. Morin the previous year. Unfortunately, Mrs. Griffith became ill and could not provide the service. The job was given back to Horace & Jean Morin.

Moving pictures of the Camp activities that year were a highlight at the Shareholders Meeting on June 1, 1938 and were shown by Mr. Fred Bray Isaacs.

George Macartney Duck was elected as President of the Windsor Rotary Club (1918) for the term in 1938 - 39.
