A new kitchen wood burning stove, a # 29 Fireco Bridgewall range with “B” finish, with pipe at the back and reservoir, from the Hall Foundry Co. Limited, of Hespler, at a price of \$132.50 was installed this year. The Camp purchased between 4 & 6 cords of Maple every year to burn in the stove. The stove it replaced was also wood burning stove which was sold to “The Ardbeg Hotel”, owned by Jimmy Ainslie.

Per day rates were \$5.00 for members or guests of a member whom the member was responsible for and \$6.00 for other guest. Camp was opened on July 8th, 1949.

A new fishing boat and motor were purchased by the Club and a new light dock was built for the small boats with free barrels found and brought to Camp by W. J. Haslam. A new Camp Flag, 3' x 6' was purchased.

The Fairbanks - Morse 1000 watt generator was constantly overloaded this summer and finally burnt the connecting wires off in the plant. The wires were repaired and the problem was sent to the Board to investigate.

The Camp made a profit of \$178.01 this year which was put in the Surplus Account. The Surplus Account now stood at \$7,516.62 .
