More accommodations was the issue of the year. Construction began a the main sleeping cabin. It was constructed to hold five to six campers without the use of bunk beds, making it the largest capacity building in camp. The second largest sleeping capacity building is the boathouse.

A new generator, a 5000 watt Kholer, was installed this year.

Bill Winslow purchased a large 306 gallon / 1158 litre water tank for \$50.00 . It measures 100" long and 30" in diameter. This unit was placed on a scaffold up in the woods behind the Main Lodge creating a natural water pressure system supplying the camp with water. The smaller water tank installed on the second floor of the Main Lodge in 1938 was removed.

The General Meeting took place at the Windsor Club on December 3<sup>rd</sup> 1965. The 1966 Camp date were set as opening on June 30<sup>th</sup> and closing September 6<sup>th</sup> 1966. The maximum numbers of members was raised to 30 so new members could be nominated. Nominated and accepted were Ed Walters, Norm Rubin, John Uetz and John Kennedy. It was motioned by Nelson Keib, seconded by Ed Mackey that the Trustees be empowered to purchase a new boat for the Camp, spending up to \$3,000.00 with financing to be arrange to the approval of the Trustees.

The Board of Directors (Trustees) Meeting was held on December 3<sup>rd</sup> 1965 at the Windsor Club. The Camp rates were set for 1966 at \$11.00 per day for members and \$13.50 per day for guests. The off season rates were set at \$6.00 per day for members. The Camp closing date was set to two weeks after Labour Day in 1966 altering the dates set at the General Meeting.

The cooks this year were Alice and Ted Scarr who were paid \$570.00 for the season. They remained on as cooks until 1969. The cooks were paid \$550.00 for the 1965 season.

The net loss for the Camp was \$41.34 for 1995.
