Yearly dues were \$125.00 which included 5 free days but not the cook fees.

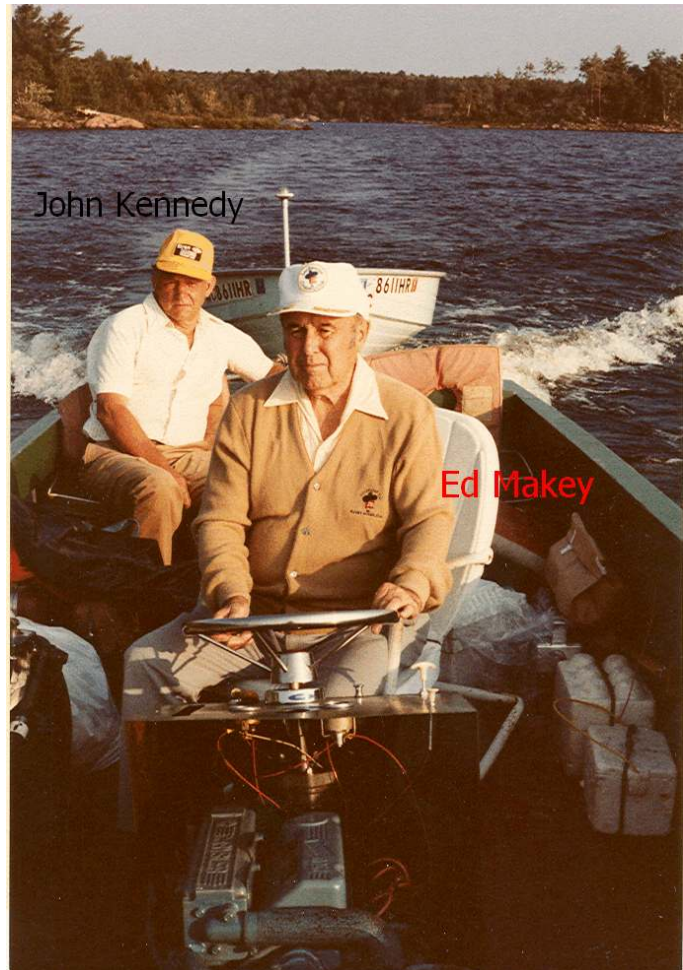
Initiation fees were set at \$125.00 on a motion from R. Surrell, seconded by Gord Dean.
