

The board authorized Bud Lutman to purchase of a
200 gallon tank with plugs and feet for the storage of
gasoline at a cost of \$35.00 . John Haddow Jr.
worked at a shipping company and wrangled a way to
ship it to Camp for free.

Bud Lutman was given the task of reporting the
damage to the lower end of The Betty Lou II
(Thundercraft) to the insurance company. A
settlement of \$2,100.00 was paid by the insurance

October 27th, 1985 Minutes at \$2500.00 for the repairs.

All outboard motors were sent out for service at the end of the season with \$1,000.00 being set aside for it. Kenny took them out and brought them back in the spring. The F.B.I. was taken out of the water and the dent & leaks fixed and rivets repaired.



The work on the main lodge was proceeding and the fireplace appeared to have been raised. The logs were ready to be installed but the kitchen wasn't pulled together yet so the shingles were not done. This stopped the burying of the dump also.

Chairs were purchased by John Haddow Sr. for use at the table on the front porch and around the card table. They were a great improvement from the others with arms and upholstered seats and backs. A true luxury.

Representation at the Annual General Meeting was noted in the minutes as 78%. The president, Rob Haddow, remarked on the excellent turnout as it showed the groups interest in the Camp and it's well being.

Dennis Pettit donated a tent to Camp for use by all members.

The Camp cook and help were Linda and Bill Holmes.

Off season Rates were increased to \$10.00 per day. Motion was made by John Haddow, seconded by Dennis Pettit. Carried. Other rates remained the same.

Resignations (3) Mike Baniewicz deceased December 1983, R. G. King, Richard Barker non payment of dues, Ron Pratt.

New members (3) Richard McKee, Dave Fenton, Mike Waller.

Mike Waller's membership was granted by the Board but had to be ratified at the 1995 Annual General Meeting. He was the son of a member and did not have to attend Camp for the two years prior as a guest.
