## 1990

The Pussy Kat, American made Crest II stripped down model which came with a 28 HP Johnson electric start motor, was bought in the States at a cost of \$9,544.00 Canadian and brought to Camp by Larry Ancypa. It has a 2400 pound capacity, extra heavy gauge aluminum pontoons and a 50 year warranty on the deck structure. The 9.9 HP motor authorized for purchase was also brought to camp by Larry.

The Main Lodge and boathouse were getting in serious shape and work had to be undertaken to ensure the deterioration wouldn't become permanent damage. Norm Stiles, a local contractor was given the OK to proceed with repairs commencing in the fall of 1990 and to be completed by the end of the season of 1991.

The estimate for the required maintenance needed on the Main Lodge came in to the Annual Meeting on October 29<sup>th</sup>, 1990 at \$11,007.00. It was decided to apply a one time assessment of \$100.00 per member to gain some of the required funds to complete the work. This was added to the yearly fee of \$175.00 for a total of \$275.00 per member which included any new members voted in at the meeting.

The motor replacement program was moving along slowly and an additional 9.9 HP motor was authorized to be purchased for \$1,475.00.

Ongoing discussions about a bath house were discussed and a project start date of 1992 was established. A vote of 23 for & 11 against was carried. Larry Ancypa was given the job of coming up with the estimated cost.

Difficulty in procuring help for the cooks position caused the membership to abandon in season help for the following year (1991).

Moved by Larry Ancypa then seconded by Rob Haddow, the amount of money paid to the Wah Wash Kesh Conservation Association was raised to \$100.00 per year from \$10.00 by unanimous vote.

Fred Issacs was asked to look into a water purification system for the Camp by the membership. This project was completed some years down the road. This was a way of eliminating the need to bring in glass bottles of water for drinking. Most Camps today still bring bottled water with them for drinking but the chlorine system should make the water drinkable.

Twelve new life jackets were authorized for purchase in the 1991 season.

A cook was not hired for this season.
