A two man craft that could support a 4 HP motor and get through shallow water like Farm Creek easily and at the same time be carried easily by two men. It is a very stable boat and much nicer to fish from than a canoe.

Dennis Pettit took over as Camp Manager of the open August week this year but allowed Orlyn Lewis & Jack Campbell to use the camp date for 1996. As Dennis is going to retire in 1999 he wanted to make sure he got a week now, while it was available.
